Language

We just finished a math unit on time and money. We did a good job with counting change, but please continue to practice at home. Now, we will begin joining and separating numbers. This will help get us ready for addition and subtraction.

We are still counting by both 10's and 5's to 100. We just began counting by 2's to 10. Eventually, we will count by 2's to 20. Also, we are still writing numbers 1-20, so be sure to practice this at home!!!
